



General Meeting Minutes

Yavapai College

August 13, 2016

The meeting was called to order at 10 a.m. with Sondra Bradshaw presiding. We had 28 people in attendance.

New members since July meeting were: Dinah Stecki and George Shriver.

Sondra introduced our speaker for this month, Art Gorski, who did a presentation on AgileBits “1Password”. He demonstrated all the features of this password management utility. This utility not only stores all your passwords but any kind of information you want to keep safe. Plus, it will Autosave and fill passwords, credit cards, and addresses into webpages with a single click. Art submitted his notes [Here](#) Bullet points on this presentation follow:

- 1Password has versions for Mac, iOS devices, Windows and Android devices.
- You can sync your information through Apple’s iCloud or Dropbox to all your devices.
- 1Password remembers everything for you. Besides passwords, it remembers bank account routing numbers, alarm codes for your house, online account numbers, social security numbers, etc. You can use *Tags* to quickly search through all your devices.
- Your data is protected behind your one *Master Password*. Unlock 1Password on your mobile device with *Touch ID*.

- 1Password is integrated into your Safari web browser so you can create passwords, fill in credit cards, and sign into your online accounts with a single click.

- Quickly launch 1Password with a browser extension.
- Take a quick tour: <https://vimeo.com/agilebits/1password>
- Pricing — From the AgileBits Inc. store (<https://agilebits.com/store>), you can purchase a single license plan for your OS X and Windows PC for \$64.99. You get a 25% discount code from PMUG, making it \$48.74. The discount code is **MUG**. You have to buy a separate plan for your iPhone and iPad; the price is \$9.99.

- There is a subscription model that is alternatively priced. This plan covers OS X **and** iOS devices: (<https://1password.com/sign-up/>) You get some extra perks such as 1 GB of Cloud storage and the ability to restore deleted data for a year. You get six months free trial with this plan.

- There is a family version where up to five members can manage who shares what passwords and documents. Account recovery can be very important when one member of the family dies; the survivor has access to all accounts.

- 1Password offers *team plans* if you are a business or a team.
- 1Password vs. Keychain: Keychain is much more limited in what it can do. Keychain is not integrated with your web browser. There are many kinds of secure information like credit cards and identity data that are hard to store with Keychain. There are no special categories in Keychain; you must just record them in *Notes*. Art feels that Keychain is awkward and clumsy and doesn't automatically save data for you the way 1Password does.

- One of Art's favorite points for using 1Password is the ease of online buying. 1Password will fill in all those cumbersome data fields including the three digit code.

- 1Password will store and fill in security questions on websites that require them.

- To launch 1Password on an iPhone or iPad, you need to use the *Share* button at the bottom of the screen and choose Safari.
- Many popular apps are building in support for 1Password iOS App Extension so you can log in with 1Password and Touch ID. Check to see if your favorite app is supported: <https://blog.agilebits.com/1password-apps/>
- Ward mentioned that in his research and presentation on “Important Websites for the Mac User,” 1Password was highly recommended as a management tool.
- Dave Rothgery recommended that if you choose to use 1Password, start with the non-critical websites and begin to integrate the program *slowly* into your data base. Before you use it on your bank accounts, for instance, get a feel of how it works on your other websites.

After the presentation, and before break, John Carter spoke briefly about TakeControlBooks.com. PMUG members are eligible to save 30% off on all the books purchased on this site. Enter the code: **CPN90219MUG**. This code will be entered on the *eSellerate* checkout page. We give away two of these books every meeting as door prizes. John suggested that you choose the *ePub* format because shows up in the *iBooks* app. There is a book on 1Password which will be very helpful if you plan to use this utility.

We took a break for Social Time and came back to the Business Meeting. Last month's Minutes were approved. David was not at the meeting so the Treasurer's Report was not given.

Workshops are going to be held in the OLLI classrooms from now on. Dates and times will be announced at a later date.

The Mac Brunch will be held at Prescott Junction on August 24.

Next month's topic will be a Facebook presentation given by John Carter. PMUG now has its own Facebook page. Search for: **PMUG Prescott**. John asked that
