Executive Summary

- The Apple Watch Series 5 replaces the Series 4
- It's a replacement because there's not that much new
- The new features are great, but not worth an upgrade from 4-to-5
- The Series 3 continues at a really low price if you want to try the Apple Watch experience
- The Series 4 is still available from 3rd parties at a somewhat lower price

What's New in Series 5?

- Always On Display with improved ambient light sensor
- Compass
- Titanium and Ceramic case options
- S5 processor (S4 on Series 4)
- 32 GB RAM (16GB on Series 4)
- Band selections are now a la carte

Always On Display

- To save power, the display dims when you're not looking at it
- Depending on the watch face and complications displayed, most information is still shown and can be seen at a glance without raising your wrist
- Some less important things, like a moving seconds hand, may not be displayed





Compass App

- Exclusive to the Series 5
- Can be set to Magnetic or True North
- Can also show elevation, inclination, and co-ordinates
