What were the rules?

- Rules which had not yet taken effect
- FCC Chairman had previously stopped first provision would have required ISPs to keep customer data secure
- Would requires ISPs to get opt-in consent from customers before selling their sensitive data, including web browsing history and app usage data
- EFF—"internet providers will need to record and store even more sensitive data on their customers, which will become a target for hackers."

What can you do?

- Switch ISPs
- Now requires customers to opt-out Contact ISP provider to opt-out of having your data sold.
- Get a VPN "A VPN can stop internet companies from selling your data — but it's not a magic bullet"

- Using an incognito window doesn't work
- Installing an ad blocker doesn't work
- If you like privacy, you should fall in love with a VPN service and/or Tor
